- *Miller v. LaSalle Bank Nat'l Ass'n*, 595 F.3d 782 (7th Cir. Ind. 2010) o Won ruling upholding broad application of new safe-harbor statute for defectively notarized mortgages.
- *Deutsche Bank Nat'l Trust Co. v. Mark Dill Plumbing Co.*, 908 N.E.2d 1273 (Ind. Ct. App. 2009) (Briefed for Amicus Curiae Ind. Land Title Ass'n) o Obtained rehearing opinion correcting original ruling severely limiting remedy of strict foreclosure.
